Pratika joins Origin Academy but starts off on a sour note with Suresh who lectures her regarding the do's and don'ts as well as the expectations of him and the management. His friend Purushothaman asks Suresh why he is so harsh on her and says not to be on the thought that women are bad based on Suresh's past experiences. (**Icons 5 to 8**)

The next sequences happens in a café between Pratika and Suresh. Pratika starts the conversation by asking Suresh to be soft by saying that new recruits need a bit of time to get accustomed to a new work environment and be more socializable with fellow colleagues.

Suresh retorts saying about himself and the reasons for him not of the socializing type. He tells Pratika how his parents considered him to be a burden and let him off only to be treated as a dog by his aunt and that even attempted suicide at the age of 12. He adds that he was bullied and tortured by those at a boarding school and didn't have friends. Suresh adds that Purushothaman is his only friend apart from a few novelists.

Pratika tells Suresh that there are there are good people like Purushothaman around him and says that she respects Suresh and is looking forward to learn from him. (Icons 9 to 16)

Pratika asks Suresh if he is pranking and that there is no one in the photo apart from him. Suresh asks Purushothaman to say hi and speak with Pratika. Pratika asks Suresh not to behave like a psycho. Suresh asks if he is a psycho and stops her from leaving his house when Pratika makes an attempt to leave and hits her by pushing her to the wall. 

The psychiatrist tells her that Purushothaman could be a phenomenon as is the case with most people who don't socialize and believe it to be the reality. Pratika asks her if Suresh can be cured and the psychiatrist replies that it is possible and needs a few sittings with her.

The next scene shows Pratika reassuring Suresh that he is alright and that he can report to the office in a couple of days and asks if he needs any help with tea or coffee. Suresh replies that he'll manage on his own and bids goodbye.

Pratika then tells her boyfriend about Suresh and curiously asks her boyfriend as to how Purushothaman would have looked to Suresh. At this juncture, Purushothaman is shown as Pratika's boyfriend. His boyfriend then retorts that *How does he know, as he hasn't seen him so far*. He also adds that the character of Suresh is disturbing him and says it would be better to make Suresh have a one on one with them and Purushothaman is shown in the background. (Icons 29 to 40)

The current research study was envisioned to look into the psychological aspects present in the 121 short film. The study revealed that although there are various genres present in short film making, psychological short films can also be made. The director has worked tremendously well to capture the essence of psychology through visuals and the engagement of the story and screenplay.
